Cynhaliwyd prosiect Treftadaeth Perllannau a Gwneud Seidr yng Nghymru, a ariannwyd gan Gronfa Dreftadaeth y Loteri, am ychydig dros ddwy flynedd rhwng 2016 a 2018.

## PERLLANNAU CYMUNEDOL

Gweithiodd y prosiect gyda 13 grwp cymunedol ar draws Cymru i blannu perllannau newydd – ac adfywio hen rai – a oedd yn cynnwys amrywiaethau gellyg perai ac afal seidr treftadaeth Cymru, gyda chyfanswm o 926 o goed wedi'u plannu ar draws y wlad. Mae gwirfoddolwyr wedi cynnal digwyddiadau gan gynnwys Dyddiau Afal a Gwaseiliau sydd wedi helpu i hyrwyddo'r perllannau fel rhan o fywyd cymunedol a ffynonellau cynnyrch lleol.

Cafodd coed seidr a pheraï ar draws Cymru brofion DNA i ganfod eu hamrywiaeth. Datgelwyd bod 73 o'r rhain yn amrywiaethau nad oeddynt wedi'u cofnodi o'r blaen. Bydd yr amrywiaethau newydd hyn yn cael eu henwi a'u cofnodi ar Gronfa Ddata Casglu Ffrwythau Cenedlaethol Brogdale.

Cafodd y coed unigryw eu lluosogi er mwyn

creu Casgliadau Cenedlaethol o goed seidr a pheraï Cymru. Mae'r rhain yn cael eu cynnal ym Mhrifysgol Aberystwyth a dau eiddo'r Ymddiriedolaeth Genedlaethol – Neuadd Erddig a Gerddi Dyffryn. Mae pedwerydd – Perllan Amgueddfa'r Gymdeithas ei hun – wedi'i rhannu dros ddau safle, un yn Llanarth ac un ychydig y tu allan i Frynbuga. Bydd y rhain yn gweithredu fel adnodd genetig i sicrhau cadwraeth yr amrywiaethau hyn fel rhan werthfawr o dreftadaeth naturiol Cymru.

Mae treialon eplesiad amrywiaeth sengl o amrywiaethau dethol wedi'u cynnal i ddatblygu proffiliau blas, a fydd yn werthfawr i gynhyrchwyr seidr sydd eisiau defnyddio'r amrywiaethau hyn yn eu cynnyrch.

The Heritage of Orchards and Cider Making in Wales was a Heritage Lottery Funded project that ran for just over 2 years from 2016-2018.

The main aim was to preserve and promote traditional orchard management and the heritage of cider and perry making in Wales.

This leaflet will provide information about the project and provide information and resources that may be useful if you are interested in Welsh Heritage trees, orcharding and/or cider making.

## COMMUNITY ORCHARDS

The project worked with 13 community groups across Wales to plant new – and regenerate old – orchards which include Welsh heritage cider apple and perry pear varieties, with a total of 926 trees planted across Wales. Volunteers have held events including Apple Days and Wassails that have helped promote the orchards as part of community life and sources of local produce.

## INVESTIGATING HERITAGE VARIETIES

Cider and perry trees across Wales were DNA tested to ascertain their variety. 73 of these were revealed to be previously unrecorded varieties. These new varieties will be named and recorded on Brogdale's National Fruit Collection Database.

Unique trees were propagated in order to create National Collections of Welsh cider and perry trees. These are being hosted at Aberystwyth University and

two National Trust properties - Erddig Hall and Dyffryn Gardens. A fourth - the Society's own Museum Orchard - is split over two sites, one in Llanarth and one just outside of Usk. These will act as a genetic resource to ensure the preservation of these varieties as a valuable part of Welsh natural heritage.

Single variety fermentation trials of selected varieties have been carried out to develop flavour profiles, which will be valuable for cider makers looking to use these varieties in their product.

## THE MODERN STORY OF CIDER MAKING IN WALES

'The Modern Story' was led by the George Ewart Evans Centre for Storytelling at the University of South Wales working in partnership with the Welsh Perry and Cider Society.

These stories capture the human tales that help us understand why our apple and pear related heritage is so important and how lives and communities have been shaped by their involvement in orchards and cider making. The collection has been lodged with the People's Collection Wales and with St Fagans National Museum of History, part of the Amgueddfa Cymru – National Museum Wales and will tour to museum venues across Wales throughout 2018.
